Shelly enjoyed volleyball and basketball. She also served as a class officer. The biggest challenge of her senior year was being editor of the *Shield*.











Our Spirit Boosters


Bump, Set, Spike!






Our Young Kingsmen



CHORUS AND BAND


BCS SHIELD STAFF


ACTIVITIES




