


Edward R. McCowen, County Superintendent

SENIOR CLASS HISTORY

I see by the calendar that it is just a few short weeks until the end of another school year, the twelfth for us Seniors. Some great days have faded and the end of a great cycle is in sight. The graduating class of 1953 is passing from the scene as a matter of course as did just another class last year and the years before that--but to us, the sixteen Seniors who will soon take our leave, this is a gross understatement. For the past twelve years, Rarden High School has been ours and ours alone.

It was in September 1941, when the solemn old bell sent forth an appeal that beckoned the thirty-odd students of our class into the hallowed halls of our Alma Mater. To Miss Rector, who tutored us through our first year of grade school, we were, as a body, wholly different from any class ever to be ushered onto the seldom changing scene. We were not far into our second year of schooling under the competent instruction of Edward McCann before we were recognized as very attentive, conscientious pupils. These qualities were quite naturally transmitted to those who occasioned to associate with us.

From the time that we so courageously and unflinchingly defied the vaccination needle of the venerable county nurse, we were always distinguished by the ever-strengthening qualities of diligence, concentration, and hard work; but these were too often misinterpreted by our teachers, be it Mrs. McCollister, Mrs. Foster, or Mrs. Ralston, as meaning "wandering" or "erratic". This peculiar nature of ours marked by a certain dull rapport between teacher and pupil, tended to give the impression of an automobile geared to reverse but which continues to inch steadily forward.

As we progressed through the sixth grade under Mr. O'Bryant, we were given further positive guidance that sent us lunging forward on our glorious errand.

Seventeen of our original class of thirty trooped into the seventh grade room in the fall of 1947, where we were entrusted to the care of Mrs. Snyder for the next two years. She very capably managed to arouse our interest (or curiosity) in the mysterious world of Science, Latin and taught us to recite "How now brown cow" as only Bette Davis or Charles Boyer would express it. We quickly adapted ourselves to our new position in "high school" and soon learned that the period bell or study hall, and the "excuse slip" were as welcome as the fifteen minute recess to which we had been accustomed.

Mr. Fouch, our next home room teacher, seemed to take a great deal of delight in straightening or correcting our rare deficiencies in Mathematics, Business and Commercial subjects, and aggressively attacked that ever present attitude of indifference with a stern and dominant hand.

Miss Wikoff immediately took to the task of improving our knowledge of American and English Literature in our Junior and Senior year and taught us the finer points of the English language throughout our high school career.


We were never regarded as a nearly complete or finished product but were kept in a state of spirited entity in order to way-lay the evils of a wandering mind. At times, though, when our more agreeable characteristics of cheerfulness and ambitiousness reached the point of "boisterousness", we were hastily reminded of that favorite panacea--the trip to the principal's office.

This year's senior class will take with it a wealth of fond memories. As a reminder of the "good ole days"; I, for instance, want to remember the familiar old water-bucket that stood just inside the door to Miss Rector's room; dusting the erasers on a sunny day against the side of the gymnasium; holding up one finger or two for permission to leave the room whether it was necessary or not; or maybe an Easter-egg hunt on the front law; or when Mrs. Ralston threw her year's collection of marbles from a window in the fifth grade room. How many of us can forget the thrill of the many basketball games (that we didn't win); our picnics at Roosevelt Lake and Serpent Mound; the trip to Detroit and Canada; practicing for "Comin' Around the Mountain" when we were Juniors. But springtime in 1953, the heyday of expectancy, the year end activities, and finally graduation will prove to be the major excitement and wonderful climax to our school days at R. H. S.
