


The staff of the 1984 Tartan Yearbook dedicates this book and presents this rose to Miss Phyllis Madeira who has given so much of herself to East High School.






The new system was considered to be a success by both the girls and the fans. Having more people enabled the cheerleaders to build larger mounds with a greater variety. At the same time, it


was also helpful to the fans, since the girls could be heard more easily than before.

East's second and final loss was to Portsmouth West, 12-6. Darrell Hood scored the lone touchdown for East. West's two scores were two tipped passes in the endzone.




In the S.O.C., the team came in 5th out of six teams. In the sectional tournament they finished 5th out of thirteen teams.





# LADY TARTANS END WITH 4-15













Lana Lutz was escorted by Darren Price. She received first runner-up after raising \$333.27. Lana was Yearbook candidate.




# YOUNG TEAM STRUGGLES TO 5-7 SEASON
































# TARTANS NET VICTORIES
























