





To repay the Seniors for a grand party, the class of "Junior" honored them with a large banquet at the Ventura Hotel in Ashland, Kentucky, on April twenty-third.

and Kathryn Blanton sing second soprano and Betty Tasker sings alto.




THE TONETTE CLASS
