



Keenan Perry and Mandi Musick won the distinction of being the Glenwood Class of 1998's Biggest Flirts.






Kory Sparks received the award for the **Best Attitude** in the Class of 1998.













Soccer



easier and left more playing time. During the couple of games that were tough, but with great determination we were able to continue to get better and win more games."




































