The Mighty Class Of '74

We entered E.H.S. on September 9, 1970, with 102 members. Elected as class officers were president—Donnie Davis, vice-president—Mike Stapleton, secretary—Sue Bussa, and treasurer—Gayle Allen. Our homecoming attendant was Gayle Allen, escorted by Jonnie Johnson. Gary Coriell and Jolinda Hughes were the first of our four pairs to win the Tartan King and Queen contest. Showing that we were a well rounded and educated class, we placed eleven on the scholarship team. Out of eleven, we had five district winners and one state winner. Our scholarship team consisted of Debbie Sommer, Joyce Newsom, Sherry Sheets, Rick Lawhun, Ramah Frazier, Steve Mershon, Dave Martin, Carolyn Estep, Debbie Mower, Jim Hicks, and Chip Brown. District winners were Steve Mershon, Dave Martin, Carolyn Estep, Debbi Sommer, and Jim Hicks. Our state winner was Debbi Sommer. Showing a glimpse of the success that was to come in later years, we put these seven on the baseball team which went on to the state semi-finals: Scot Evans, Ramah Frazier, Mike Stapleton, Gary Coriell, Jeff Cottle, Steve Falls, and Mike Mershon. Also showing we had a couple real swingers, Dave Martin and Tim Coey placed third in the state in golf.

Our sophomore year began with the election of new officers. Kris Felts became president while Jolinda Hughes served as vice-president, Sue Jarrells as secretary, and Cathy Bolton as treasurer. Sue Bussa was chosen homecoming attendant, escorted by Tim Coey. In a highly contested battle, we won the Tartan King and Queen Contest for the second time, placing Gary Schomburg and Sherry Sheets as the royal Tartans. Our

really high steppers were majorettes Kris Felts, Sue Jarrells, and Jolinda Hughes. Giving our team a little spirit were reserve cheerleaders Sherry Sheets, Denise Mower, Carolyn Turner, Sue Bussa, and Donna Montavon as captain. Serving as prom waiters and waitresses were Jeff Cottle, Mike Stapleton, Marty Scott, Kevin Jenkins, Jolinda Hughes, Kris Felts, Sue Jarrells, and Gayle Allen. Not quite as many but just as bright were Janie Bryant, Cathy Bolton, Steve Falls, Jim Hicks, and Carolyn Estep on the scholarship team. District winners were Jim Hicks and Carolyn Estep. Our state winner was Jim Hicks with fourth place. Kevin Jenkins went to the state track meet, and Tim Coey captured first place in the district and seventh in the state in golf.

The main event of our junior year was the prom, with the theme of "Dancin' in the Moonlight." The class was put into the capable hands of president Gayle Allen Glenn, vice-president Kevin Jenkins, secretary Donna Montavon, and the treasurer Cathy Bolton. Chosen as our homecoming attendant was Kris Felts, escorted by Tim Coey. Varsity cheerleaders were Joan Whitt, Gayle Allen Glenn, Sue Bussa, and Donna Montavon as captain. Jolinda Hughes, Sue Jarrells, and Kris Felts were our majorettes. For the third consecutive year, the class of '74 won the Tartan King and Queen contest, with candidates Mike Stapleton and Cathy Bolton. Inducted into the National Honor Society were Cathy Bolton, Kris Felts, Steve Falls, Carolyn Estep, and Ramah Frazier. Our classmates on the scholarship team were Jim Hicks, Carolyn Estep, Debbi Sommer, Steve Mershon, Cathy Bolton, Steve Falls, and Dave Martin. District

winners were Jim Hicks, Debbi Sommer, Steve Mershon, and Dave Martin. Our representative to Girls' State was Carolyn Estep, and Steve Mershon was the representative to Boys' State. Supporting our hunches back in our freshman year, seven of our juniors helped bring home the state championship trophy in baseball. These seven champs were Ramah Frazier, Jeff Cottle, Mike Stapleton, Gary Coriell, John Toppins, Mike Mershon, and Steve Falls. Fred Justice was chosen All-SOC in football. Selected to represent us in the Miss River Days Pageant was Sue Bussa, and Carolyn Estep was awarded the Junior Cup.

As we entered East to begin our last year together, we were led by president Kris Felts, vice-president Jeff Cottle, secretary Sue Bussa, and treasurer Cathy Bolton. Sue Bussa was varsity cheerleader and captain. Majorettes were Kris Felts, Sue Jarrells, and Jolinda Hughes. Sue Bussa was chosen as homecoming queen, and she was escorted by John Toppins. Jeff Cottle escorted senior attendant Sue Jarrells. Once again, with candidates Jeff Cottle and Janie Bryant, we captured the Tartan King and Queen title, and set a school record of winning the contest the four consecutive years. Serving on the scholarship team were Carolyn Estep, Steve Falls, Steve Mershon, Gary Schomburg, and Debbi Sommer. District winners were Carolyn Estep, Steve Mershon, and Debbi Sommer. Steve Mershon and Debbi Sommer also received state honors. Inducted into the National Honor Society were Steve Mershon, Janie Bryant, Tim Coey, Karen Frasure, Gary Schomburg, Debbie Mower, Debbi Sommer, and Joyce Newsom. Steve Mershon, Sue Bussa,

and Denise Mower were delegates to the Mock Security Council at Marshall University and were awarded second runners-up. Displaying outstanding athletic ability again, Donnie Davis was named All-SOC in football, with Paul Robbins, Mike Riggs, Scot Evans, Chip Brown, and Jim Sturgeon receiving honorable mention. Mike Stapleton was named Mr. Football, and Paul Robbins and Harry Mayhew were runners-up. In basketball, Tim Coey was chosen Player of the Week and All-SOC, and Jeff Cottle and John Toppins received SOC honorable mention. Special awards given to our classmates included Elk's Youth Leadership Award, Jaycee's Outstanding Young Citizen Award, and Sandy Pence Award to Carolyn Estep; DAR Award, Kiwanis Outstanding Senior Award, Betty Crocker Award, and Outstanding Home Economics Student to Cathy Bolton; National Merit Scholarship to Steve Mershon; Governor's Leadership Award to Kris Felts; and Distinguished Musicians Award to Janie Bryant. Cathy Bolton, Carolyn Estep, and Steve Mershon were recognized in "Who's Who Among American High School Students," and Dave Martin and Steve Mershon were delegates to the Rotary Club. Recipients of State Board certificates were Carolyn Estep, Ram Frazier, Dave Martin, and Steve Mershon. On Tuesday, June 4, we graduated at Allard Park. Class valedictorians were Carolyn Estep, Jim Hicks, and Dave Martin, and salutatorians were Cathy Bolton and Steve Mershon. Even though we had only 79 class members, we will always be remembered as the MIGHTY CLASS OF '74, and we will always remember our days together at East.

1973 East Football

UNIOTO—East opened its season at home with Ross County visitors, Unioto. East has never lost to Unioto in its previous 5 meetings and tonight was no exception. East held Unioto in its first services, and on our first offensive play of the season, Chip Brown took a pitch-out from Gary Coriell, and behind two great blocks from Danny Ball and Harry Mayhew, scooted 49 yards for the T.D. He later scored again from 2 yards out after a fumble recovery by Scot Evans at the Unioto 8-yard line set up the score. The final score was East 12, Unioto 6. East was led offensively by Brown, and Mayhew with 95 and 80 yards respectively and on defense by Chip Brown, Donnie Davis, Scot Evans, and Ed Holbrook.

WEST—East returned home to face West. The game was very close all the way, with West winning out 14-6. West took the lead early on a Farley-to-Baker T.D. pass. The extra point made it 7-0. East scored very late in the third quarter on a 1-yard plunge by Ed Kegley to make it 7-6. The game remained a defensive struggle until late in the game when Butch Rose, West's fullback, rambled 29 yards to put the game away. WHEELERSBURG—The ninth game of the season saw East play powerful Wheelersburg at Allard Park. The Pirates proved convincingly why they were S.O.C. champions, with a 65-20 victory over the Tartans. The bigger Wheelersburg linemen overpowered the East defense, giving their backs room to run. East never gave up and played hard and tough all the way. The passing attack again accounted for two scores, Purdy to Mershon for 36 yards, and Purdy to Davis for 32 yards. Ed Holbrook returned a recovered fumble 65 yards for the final score. Extra points were scored on a Purdy-to-Scot Evans pass. The 20 points were the most scored on Wheelersburg all season. On offense the passing of Rob Purdy and the receiving of Mike Mershon and Don Davis were again the highlights of the game. On defense, Chip Brown, Don Davis, and Harry Mayhew were outstanding.

BATAVIA—East Traveled west to meet first-time opponent, Batavia. The running of Chip Brown in the first half and Darrell Logan in the second half paved the way for an East 24-8 victory. Chip Brown had 77 yards rushing and Darrell Logan had 78 yards rushing—mostly on end sweeps. East's only score came with 51 seconds left in the first half as Ed Kegley broke over from 1 yard out, following a 60-yard drive. The extra point pass from Coriell to Davis was good and turned out to be the margin of victory. Valley scored early in the third quarter on a pass from Street to Merritt and the extra point was no good. Valley let one other scoring opportunity pass by after a penalty nullified an apparent T.D. and the East defense then put up a great goal line defense. Harry Mayhew and Gary Coriell again led the East rushing attack and the offensive line played well. The defense was led by Coriell and Darrell Logan along with Jim Sturgeon, Mark Shuter, and Paul Robbins.
