RIVER DAYS 1980





Judging was based on personal interviews, evening gown, swimsuit, and talent competition, the same criteria used at state and national levels.



The local pageant was sponsored for the fifth year by Epsilon Xi chapter of Beta Sigma Phi Sorority.

Although Julie did not place within the top ten finalists, she well represented Portsmouth East High School and the city of Portsmouth, Ohio.







The Portsmouth East Football team faced a tough schedule finishing with a 2-6-1 record.



The team started out and finished the season playing good football but during the middle of the season they lost some intensity.




A **NEW** OUTLOOK . . . A 1981 YEARBOOK

"I Got A Beautiful Feeling"




The Tartans also participated in many parades throughout the year. They were even privately reviewed by First Lady Roselyn Carter in Huntington.


