The mighty Minford Falcons recorded their best record ever in the 1984-85 campaign with a mark of 7 wins and 3 losses. The Falcons scored 25 touchdowns, a school record. The defensive unit ranked one in Southern Ohio and the offense second. Of the season, Coach Berry said, "It was a pleasure to be associated with this fine group of young men, the most successful ever fielded here at Minford." Named to the 1st team S.O.C. were Rodney Palmer, Kelly Cinereski, Miles Rayburn, and Raymond Hammonds. Rayburn led the team with 112 tackles and was selected to the 1st team All Southeastern District. Some other individual accomplishments were Hammonds rushing for 1,009 yards on 160 carries with 10 touchdowns. Shepherd's 11 touchdown passes, and Steve Martin's 8 touchdown receptions.





## BASKETBALL GIRLS GO 10-8






## RESERVE WINS S.O.C. CHAMPIONSHIP


## GIRL'S TRACK



We are pleased with this year's delegation and hope that they will continue to make us proud.








