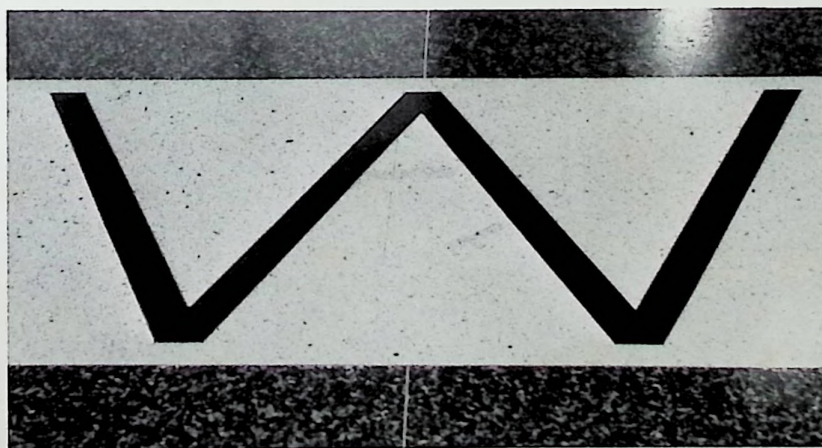
Foreword

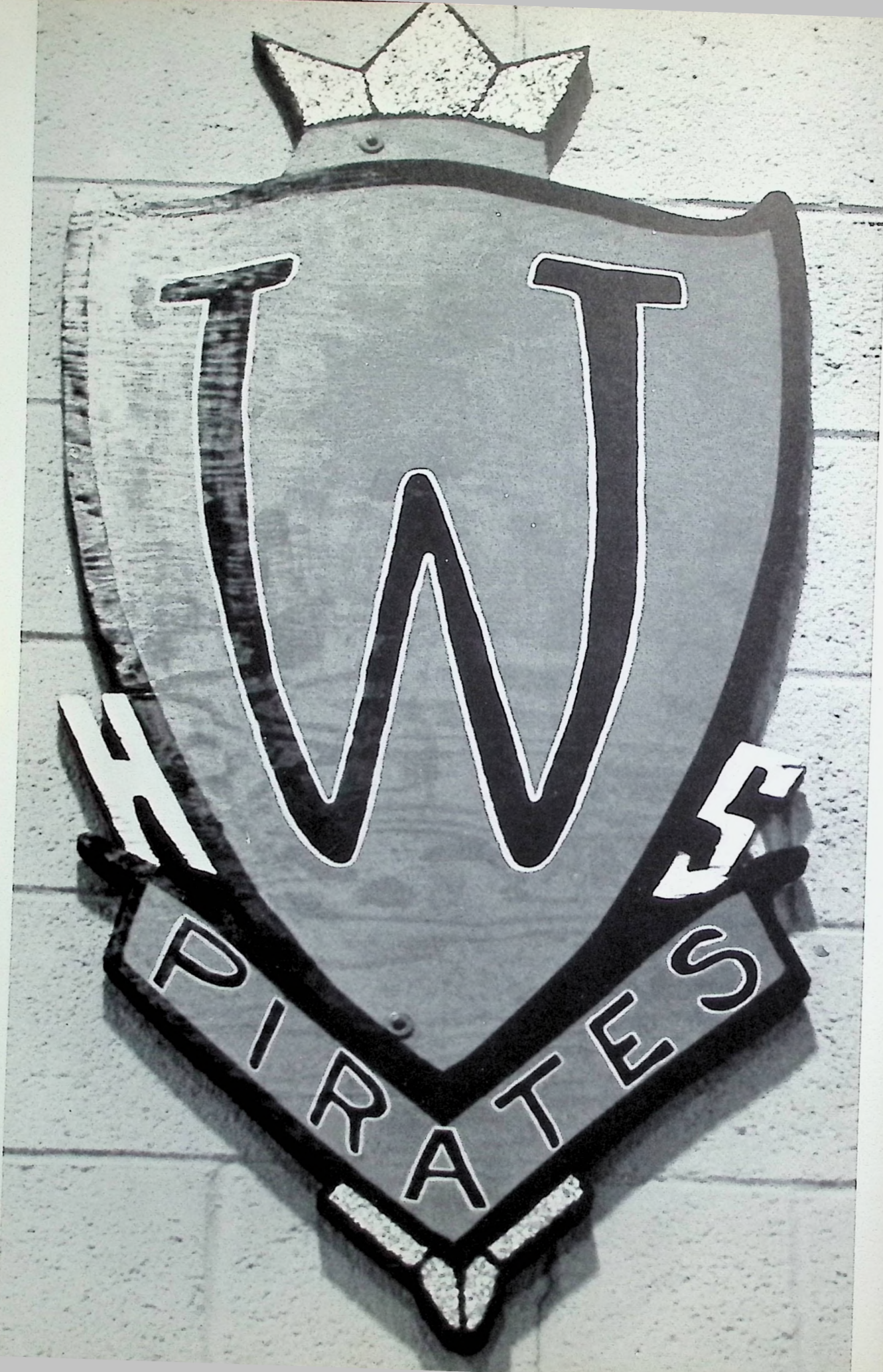

Woodworking and architectural drawing classes combined creative ability and manual labor in making various projects. Auto and power mechanics were also offered through the Vocational Department.

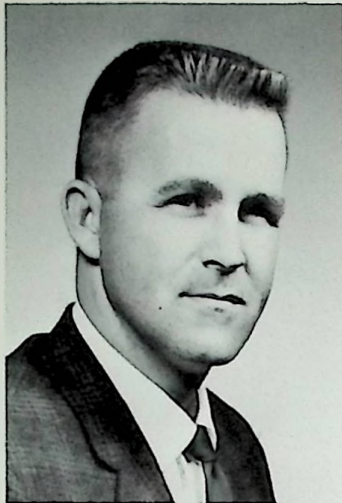

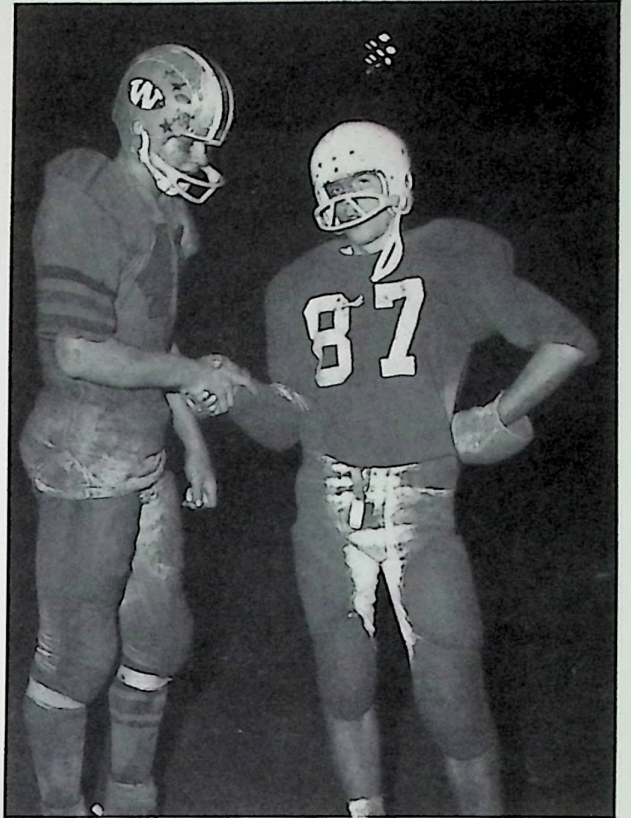

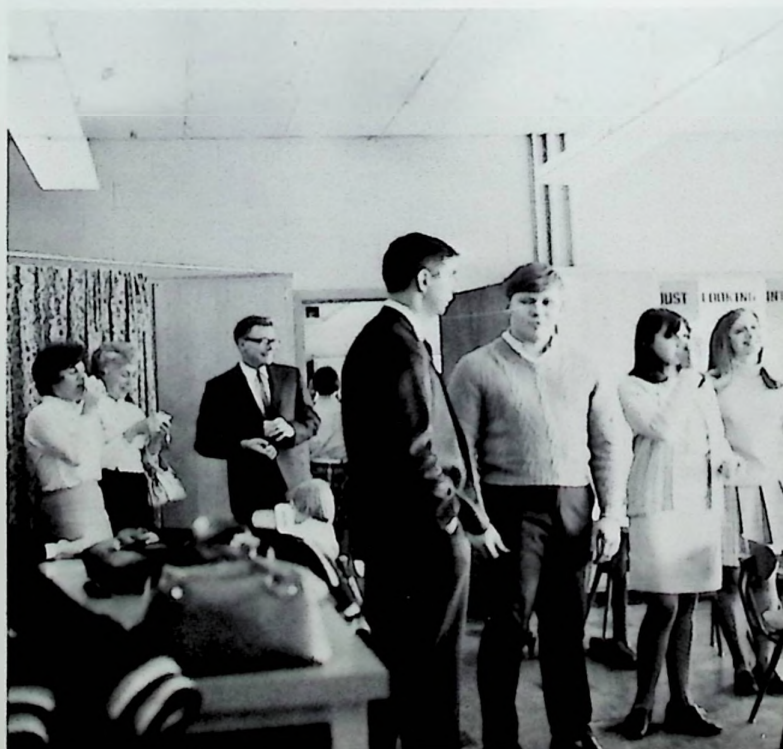
National Honor Society

Money was raised for a trip by selling donuts and magazines, washing cars, and by giving an annual Christmas play.

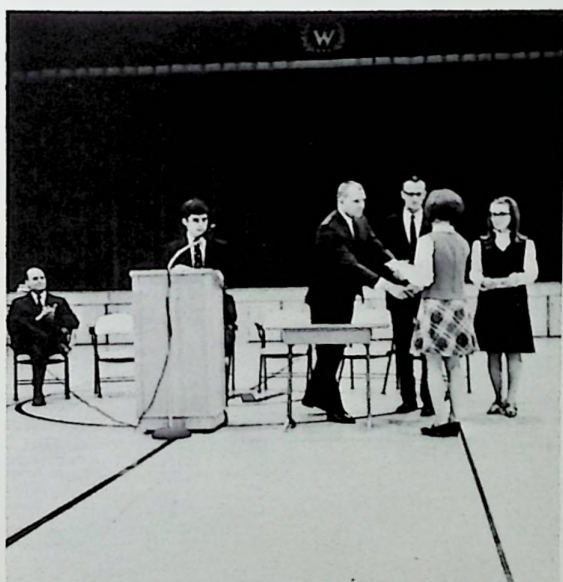

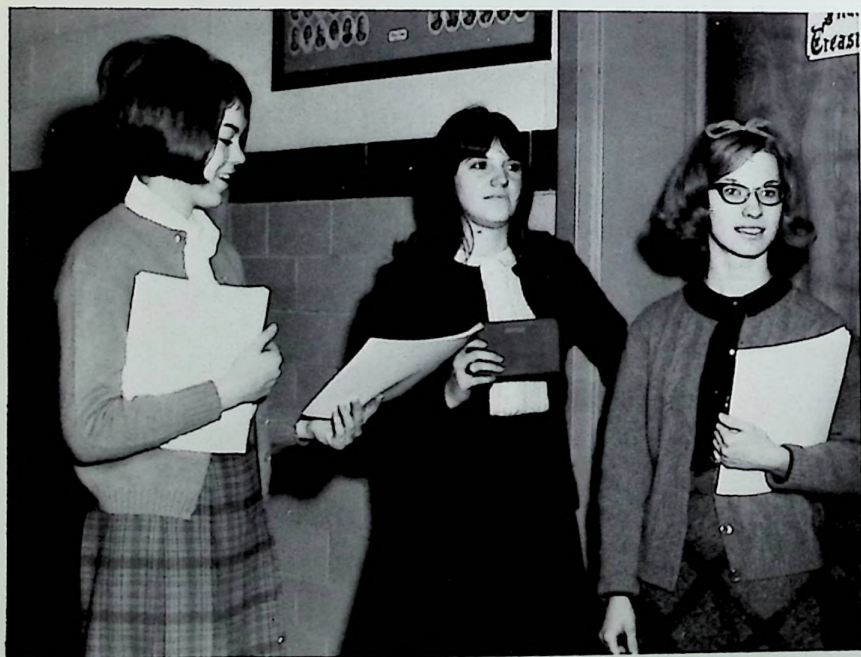
The Wheelersburg High School Student Council met in regular session to let members air their problems during the school year. They also brought in teachers to discuss these problems.

Rose Boll won the Grand Award for girls at the local science fair.

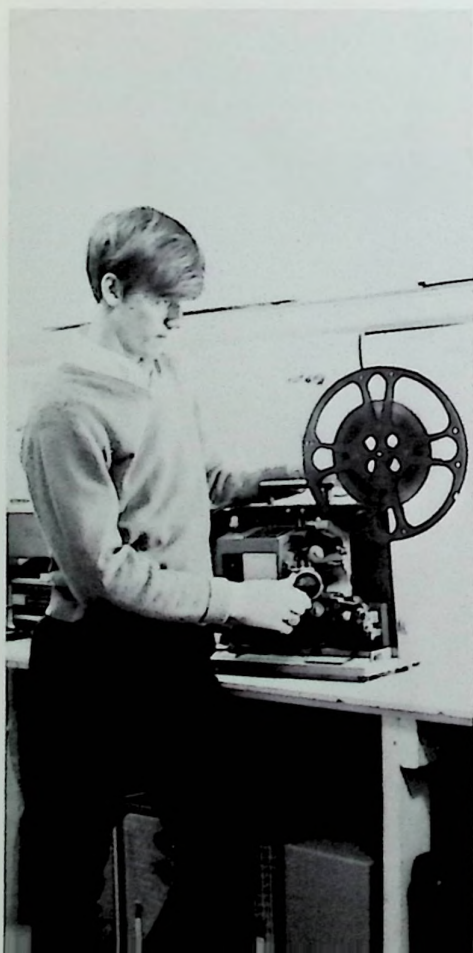

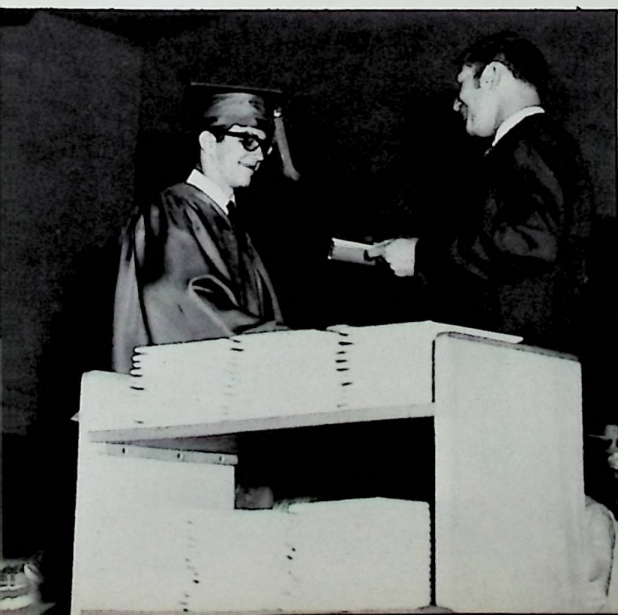
A Farewell To W.H.S.
