At last we have reached our fourth and last year; the busiest as well as the most enjoyable. The goal is now in sight.

Soon after school began, we elected our class officers. Miss Harrel was chosen for our adviser and Junior Kuhner for president. Since it is the responsibility of the Senior Class to publish the "Tattler", staff members were chosen and we started to work. We had several dollars in our treasury, carried over from our Junior year, so in October, we decided we would give a party, with plenty to eat. It was enjoyed by everyone. In March, we gave the play "Wild Ginger", under the direction of Miss Harrel, for the benefit of the dental clinic. Our class colors, green and gold; class flowers, red and white roses; and our motto, "Love Conquers All", were also chosen this month.

We are proud of the fact that we were able to publish this Annual, and also that we will be members of the Alumni of South Webster High School. We hope that the class that follows in our foot steps will be very successful and hope that they will appreciate our school as much as we do. We are very grateful for the patience and cooperation of our teachers.

So we say: Farewell, South Webster High.
