PHS QUIZ BOWL TEAM

SCIOTO COUNTY QUIZ BOWL COMPETITION FORMALLY STARTED AS A COUNTRYWIDE LEAGUE-INCLUDING PORTSMOUTH, PORTSMOUTH EAST, AND NOTRE DAME HIGH SCHOOLS AT THE BEGINNING OF THE SCHOOL TERM.

BEFORE THIS SCHOOL YEAR STARTED, 12 HIGH SCHOOLS AGREED TO PARTICIPATE. A SCHEDULE WAS SET UP SO THAT SCHOOL PLAYS EACH OF THE OTHER 11 SCHOOLS FROM DIFFERENT GRADE LEVELS, WITH ONLY FOUR FROM EACH OF SCHOOLS PLAYING AT A TIME. AT SPECIFIED INTERVALS DURING A GAME, COACHES MAY REPLACE 1 OR MORE PLAYERS.


A GAME CONSISTS OF TWO 15 MINUTE HALVES, WITH A SHORT BREAK BETWEEN FOR THE QUIZ KIDS TO RELAX THEIR OVERTAXED BRAINS.

THE COMPETITION IS SIMILAR TO THAT OF HIGH Q, TELEVISED AT 1:30 p.m. SUNDAYS ON WOWK-TV 13, IN WHICH SEVERAL LOCAL BOWL TEAMS SOMETIMES PARTICIPATE. QUESTIONS ARE ALTERNATED IN FIVE CATEGORIES-MATH, SCIENCE, SOCIAL STUDIES, LANGUAGE ARTS, AND CURRENT EVENTS.

THE EMPHASIS IS PLACED ON PARTICIPATION RATHER THAN WINNING. THE IDEA OF INITIATING THE COMPETITION WAS TO RECOGNIZE ACADEMIC ABILITIES OF THE MORE ABLE STUDENTS IN THE SAME WAY THAT MUSIC AND ATHLETIC SKILLS ARE RECOGNIZED.

THE JUNIORS SELECTED FROM PORTSMOUTH HIGH SCHOOL FOR THE SCIOTO COUNTY HONORS PROGRAM WERE ALETHA SHIPLEY, MAGGIE APEL, AND MAURICE FRIED. ALTERNATES SELECTED FOR THE PROGRAM WERE JAY JONES, TERRI RUGGLES, AND PHILLIP GERLACH.

THE SCIOTO COUNTY HONORS PROGRAM IS A UNIQUE EVENT IN THE UNITED STATES FOR GIFTED HIGH SCHOOL JUNIORS. THIS TYPE OF PROGRAM IS ONE OF THE MOST IMPORTANT THINGS HAPPENING IN EDUCATION TODAY. THE PROGRAM CONSISTED OF A SERIES OF FIVE SEMINARS AT THE SCIOTO COUNTY JOINT VOCATIONAL SCHOOL AND FOLLOW-UP FIELD TRIPS.

HUMANITIES DAY, THE FIRST SEMINAR, WAS HELD SEPTEMBER 24. THE FOLLOW-UP FIELD TRIP WAS A TOUR OF THE OHIO STATE AND CAPITAL UNIVERSITY CAMPUSES ON OCTOBER 3. ON OCTOBER 23, SCIENCE DAY WAS HELD WITH A FOLLOW-UP FIELD TRIP ON NOVEMBER 15 TO TOUR TWO SOLAR PONDS AT OHIO STATE UNIVERSITY. ENVIRONMENT DAY WAS HELD ON NOVEMBER 25 WITH A FOLLOW-UP FIELD TRIP IN LATE MARCH TO BARNEBEY CENTER IN FAIRFIELD COUNTY. ON MARCH 23, POLITICAL SCIENCE DAY WAS HELD WITH ITS FIELD TRIP TO THE STATEHOUSE WHILE THE LEGISLATURE WAS IN SESSION. THE LAST SEMINAR WAS ARTS DAY, APRIL 26 WITH THE FIELD TRIP TO THE CINCINNATI SCHOOL FOR THE PERFORMING ARTS.


PHS STUDENT IN MERIT SEMIFINALS



THE SEMIFINALISTS ANNOUNCED REPRESENT THE HIGHEST SCORES IN EACH STATE.






