With everything we have to think about, its good to

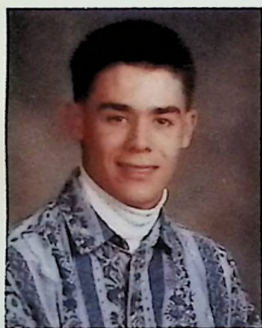

reunion and left the scene of the slaughter the Reds had received at the hands of the Cardinals.

roof of this lodge was a sign which, in glowing neon green letters, read **STANLEY'S ROCKY MOUNTAIN HUNTING LODGE**. Below this in neon blue letters was **FISHIN', HUNTING, TRAPPING SUPPLIES AND CARRY-OUT**. Also inside I talked to **Larry Cantrell** and **Phil Colley**, employees at this mountain hideaway.

Unable to use my snowmobile to travel to my next stop, I was forced to use snowshoes to reach the secluded ski resort that was owned by **Jamie Jessee** and **Kristie Williams**. After a

brief stay here, I then moved south to New Mexico.

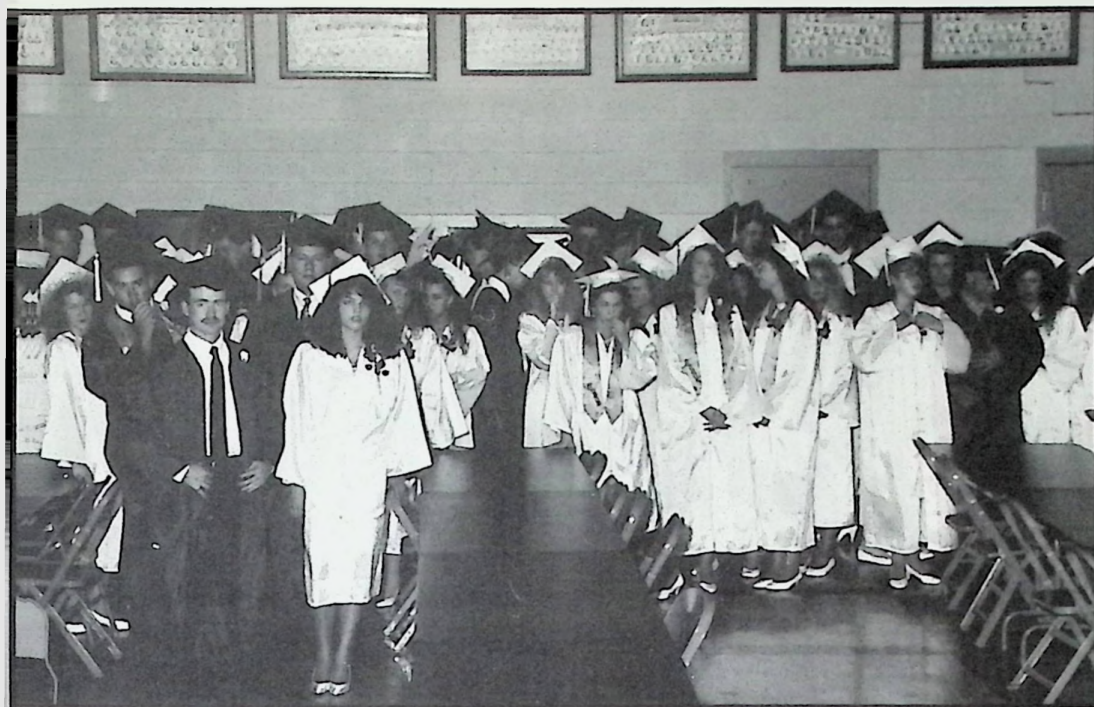

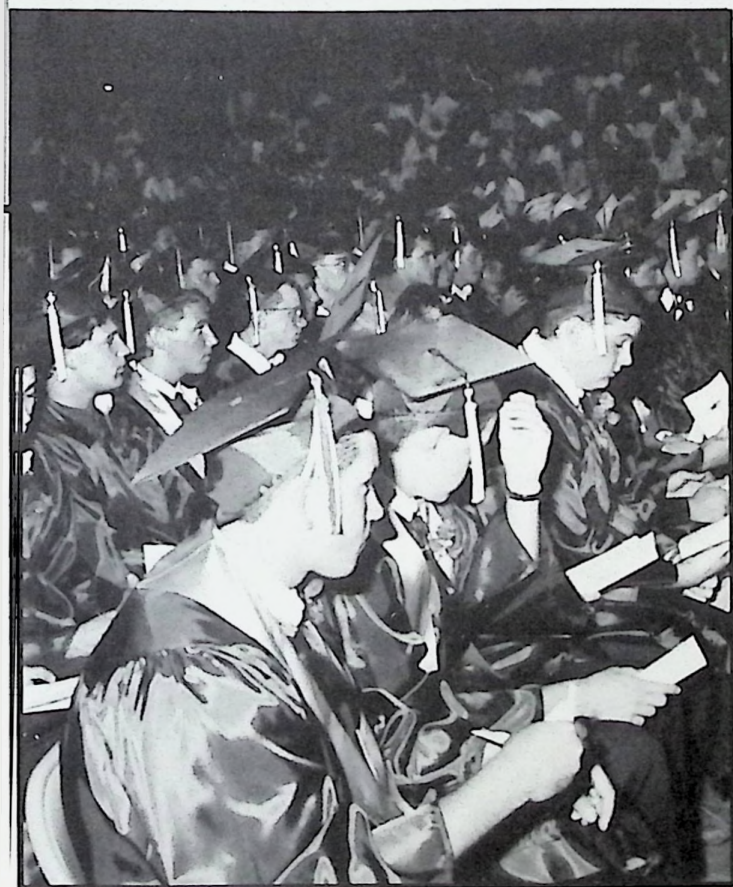

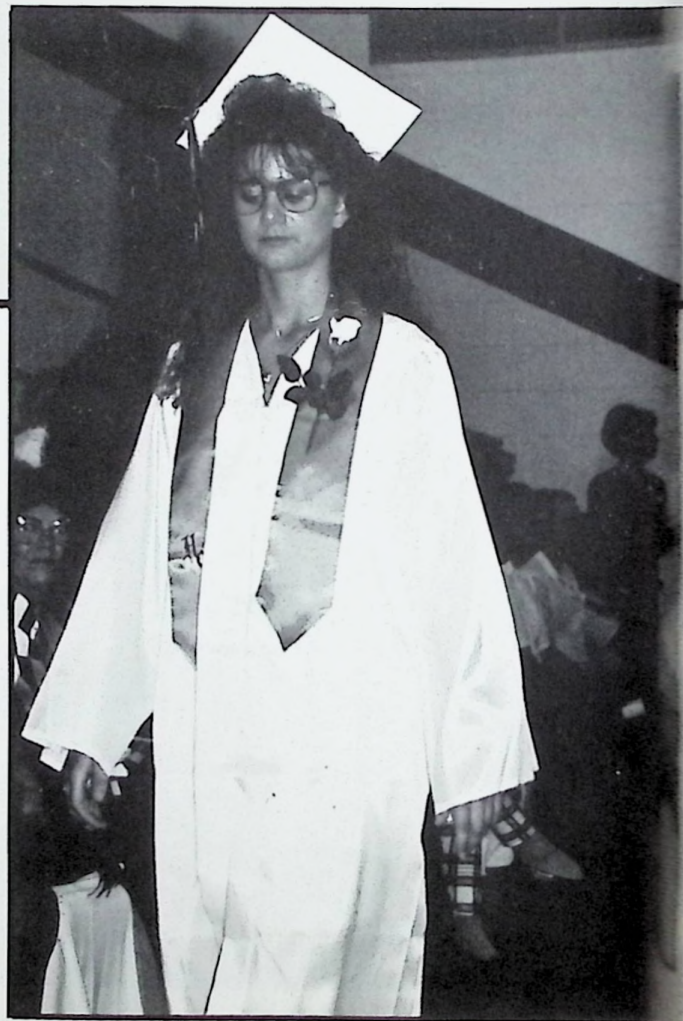

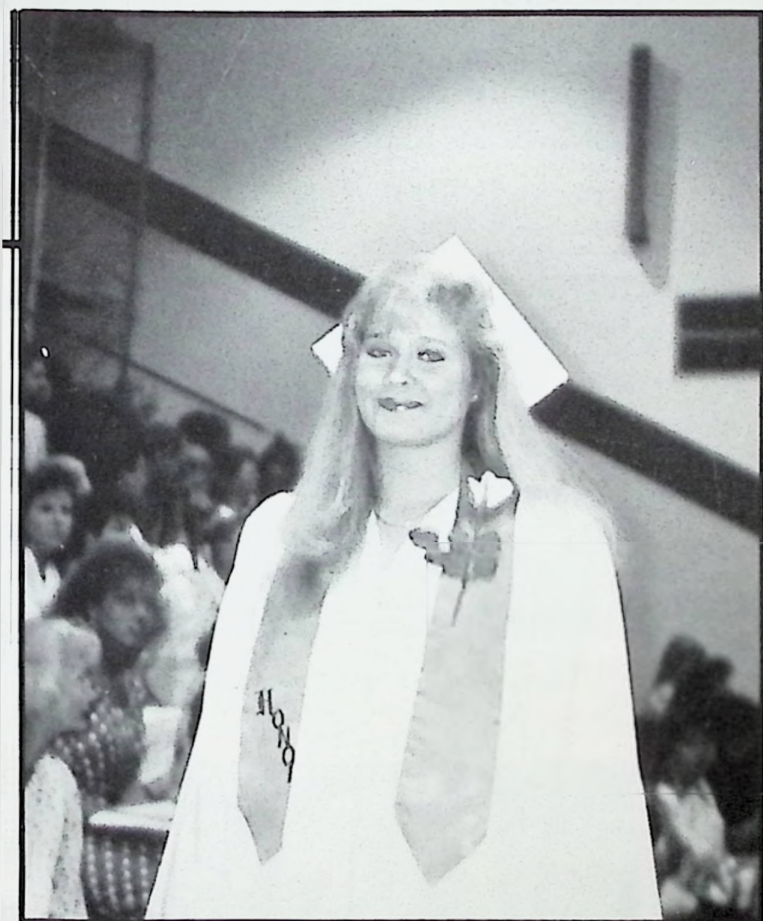

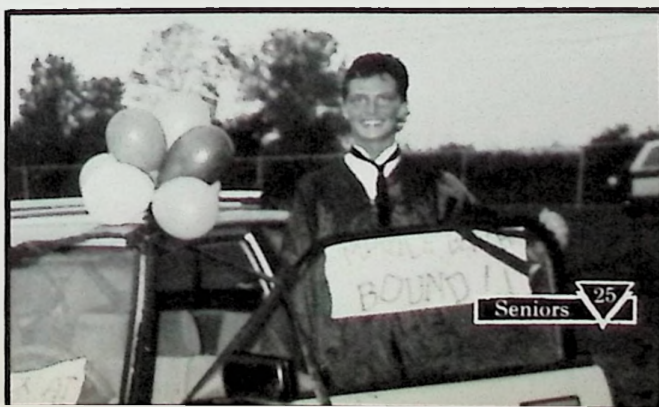

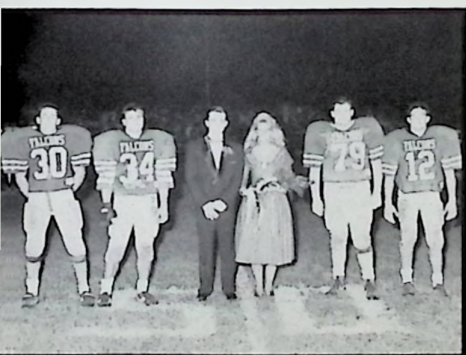

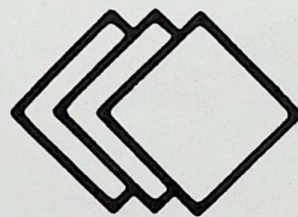

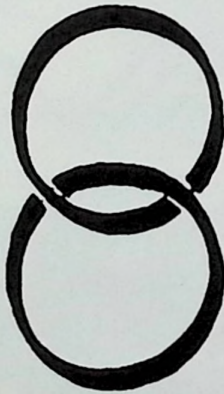

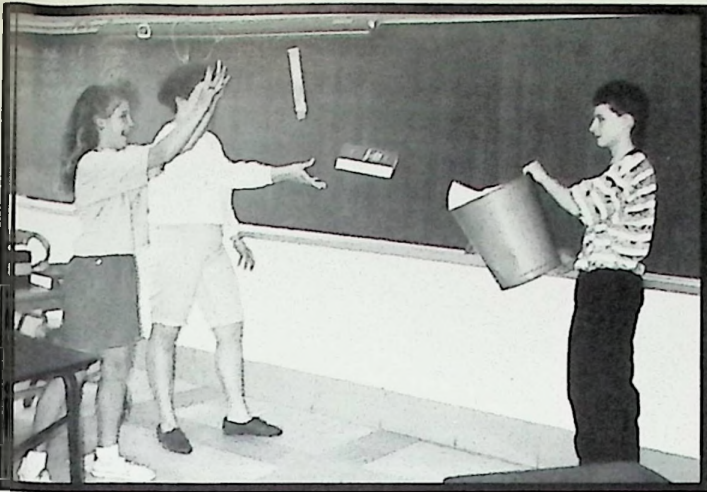


"WHAT'S HOT"

The project consisted of frying pancakes to test the skillet's heat distribution, and then boiling water to test the pans' heat transfer by conduction.





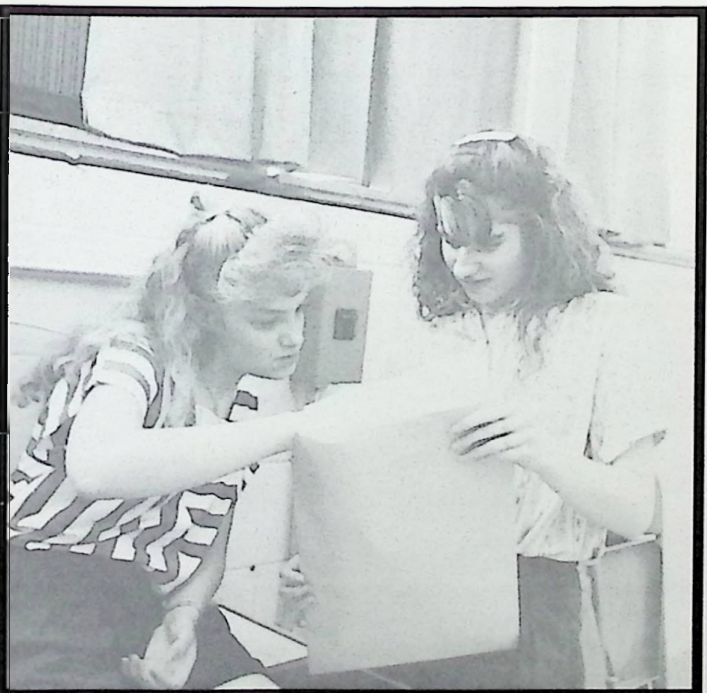

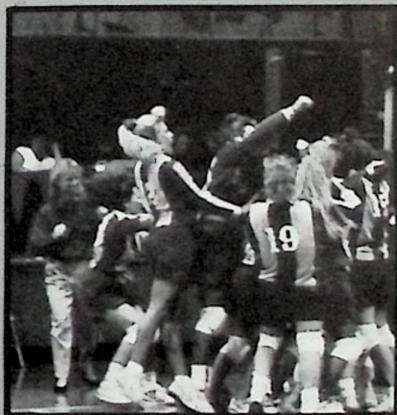

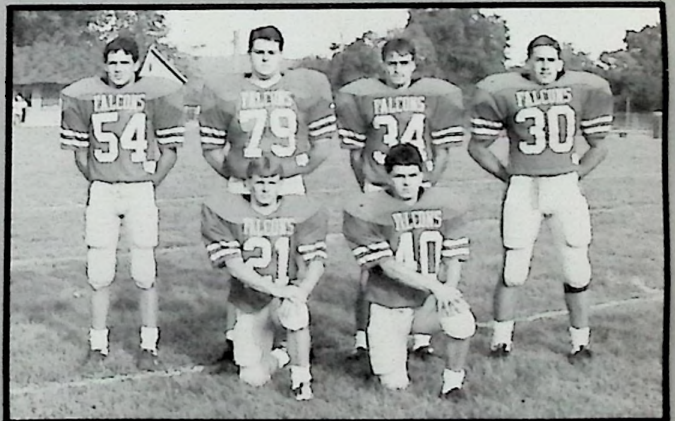

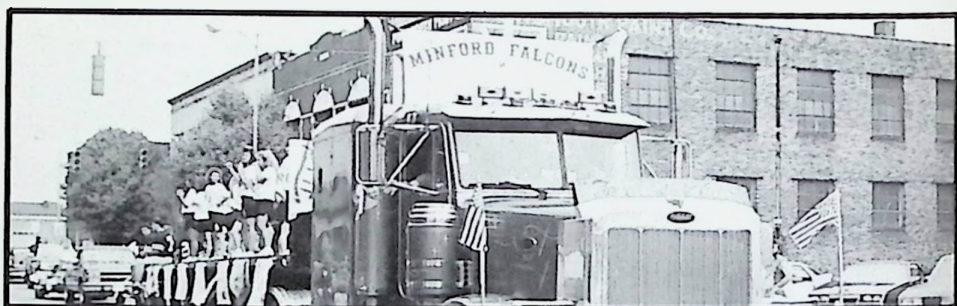

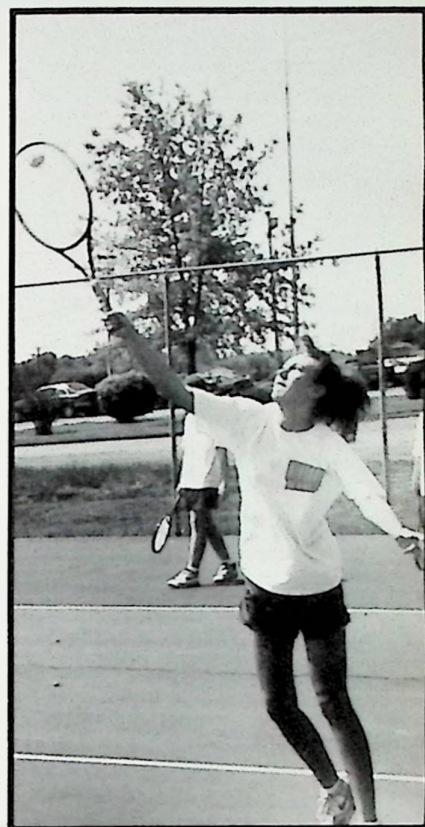
