

GHS GOES ON-LINE




Students select a password to secure their computer work. Librarian Kathie Porter enters the password and ID of Brian Fitch.



Students in Mrs. Cabilish's English II class do research for reports. Chasity Yazell, Jared Cyrus and Sara White take their turns at the computer stations.




Just for fun, senior Brandon Slone creates a masterpiece using the Linkway program. Students can adjust the program from simple to complex graphic designs.








GOLF




























PINOCCHIO !




NEED
